Attendance

The attendance register is marked twice a day. If a pupil is absent for part of the day, this is recorded. Allowances are made for medical appointments and therefore it is important to inform your child's teacher in writing, if he/she has to be absent from school. Similarly, teachers should be informed if your child is sick, otherwise an "unauthorised absence" is recorded. Absence notes are provided for your use. Absence notes must be provided for all absences, regardless of duration. The school has now an absence telephone line.
