Language and Literacy

Writing and Grammar Work

- Revision of nouns as a person, place, animal or thing.
- Common nouns and special nouns.
- Recognising/using adjectives in sentences.
- Recognising/using verbs in sentences.
- Recognising/using adverbs in sentences.
- Correct use of plural nouns—s, es, ies, ves.
- Comprehension activities to encourage answering questions in full sentences.
- Reading and writing questions
- Making and punctuating a list
- A variety of writing forms :-
 - Poetry
 - Factual
 - Creative
 - Letter Writing
- Activities linked to weekly spellings.
- Sequencing everyday activities.
- Continue with joined handwriting skills in class before using in Literacy Homeworks from February.

Phonics

- Phonics—Jolly Phonics .
Some letters are silent e.g. b, w, k, wh,
Some letters make new sounds e.g. ph for f,
ea for e
A sound can be made from a variety of
groups of letters e.g. ai, ee, ie, oa, ue.

Reading

- Set guided reading book to share at home nightly.
- Shared reading from Bug Club online available to all pupils.
- Library book—may be changed each week.
- Class stories including those linked to WWII

Talking and Listening

- Circle Time—a structured class activity to encourage all pupils to speak, listen, interact and share concerns and ideas.
- Follow and relate instructions.
- Listen and contribute to group and class discussions.

Numeracy and Mathematics

Number work

- Number after/before up to 100/1000.
- Ordering numbers up to 100/1000.
- Recognise and use greater than and less than signs.
- Round numbers to the nearest 10.
- Vertical and horizontal addition and subtraction of TU and HTU with bridging and decomposition.
- Multiplication - 2x, 5x, 10x, 3x and 4x.
- Vertical and horizontal multiplication of TU and HTU with bridging
- Recognise simple fractions of shapes and numbers.
- Recognise simple fractions 1/2, 1/4, 1/3.
- Introduce division as equal sharing and learn alongside multiplication facts.
- Correct use of £ and pence in money work.
- Working out shopping bills to 50p, £1, £5.
- Giving change from 50p, £1, £5.

Time

- Number of days in each month—revise rhyme
- Using calendar and reading information on monthly basis e.g. How many full weeks? How many Fridays?
- Look at and use 5 minute intervals on **past** side of clock.
- Simple timetable problems.

Data Handling

- Collating and representing data in Venn diagrams, Carroll diagrams and Bar charts.
- Interpreting data from tally charts, Venn diagrams, Carroll diagrams and simple Bar charts.

Fractions

- Recognise simple fractions of shapes and numbers.
- Recognise simple fractions 1/2, 1/4, 1/3.
